#### 1. Conferences and workshops

- 1) The Postgraduate and Early Career Researcher Research Leadership and Management Workshop, Hobart 26-28, October 2009 (presented by The ARC Asia Pacific Futures Research Network and School of Asian Languages and Studies, University of Tasmania)

This is a national workshop for early career researchers and postgraduates working in the field of Asia and Pacific Studies. The purpose is to equip early career researcher and postgraduate participants with the skills necessary to engage in productive research. Through the generosity of the ARC Asia Pacific Futures Research Network, workshop participants will be offered return airfares and two nights' accommodation in Hobart.

2) PhD Top-up scholarship at the University of Melbourne

The Faculty of Arts at the University of Melbourne is looking for high-calibre interstate graduates with the knowledge, skills and passion to make a positive contribution to the world. The Faculty is offering top-up scholarships for outstanding interstate PhD applicants who successfully secure an Australian Postgraduate Award (APA) to begin their research in 2010. Successful candidates will be awarded an additional \$7,500 on top of the APA award - taking it to approximately \$30,000 annually. Candidates must have completed tertiary studies at least equivalent to a four year Australian bachelor degree with a minimum result of first-class honours, and have strong results overall for their final two years of study. All eligible interstate PhD applicants will automatically be considered for a top-up scholarship when applying for an APA. Applications close 30 October 2009. Titles that can be searched include Kaisha shikiho, Joho chishiki imdas, Gendai yogo no kiso chishiki, Nihon jinmei daijiten, the Kodansha encyclopedia of Japan, Dejitaru daijisen, Kagaku gijutsu ryakugo daijiten, Nihon rekishi chimei taikai.
